The Lead IHBT (Adolescent) will clinically supervise and evaluate IHBT therapists and services, attend all program specific staff meetings both internally and externally. Duties include, but not limited to, the following:

**Direct Care:**

- Promote alignment of practice with wraparound values and the fidelity to the IHBT model.
- Maintain effective working relationships with staff, clients, and others involved in the IHBT program.
- Assist with the assessment, management, and resolution of crisis situations with clients and their families which require 24/7 on call responsibilities.
- Transport clients, as needed for schedule appointments or in crisis situations.
- Provide regular updates and status of clients' progress to the Program Director.
- Utilize safe work practices for self and others.
- Utilize knowledge of clients in treatment planning.
- Ability to work respectfully with culturally diverse populations.

**Indirect Care:**

- Provide effective clinical supervision, consultation, and coaching for staff in the IHBT program.
- Complete outcomes and other relevant data and reporting duties.
- Display professionalism and team-oriented attitudes.
- Ability to be well organized and utilize effective time management skills.
- Participate (and pass requirements where applicable) in all required trainings on an ongoing basis.
- Participate in internal and external staff meetings and stakeholder meetings as needed.

**Required Qualifications:**

- Master's degree and LPCC or LISW (NPI and Medicaid numbers)
- Knowledge and understanding of mental health diagnoses, symptomatology and treatment programming of children/youth.
- Experience working with behaviorally/emotionally challenged children/youth.

- Communicate accurately and effectively, both verbal and written.
- Demonstrate effective decision-making skills and utilize good judgment.
- Knowledge of mental health services in the community.
- Work professionally, effectively, and collaboratively with others.
- Proficient computer skills; MS Word, Excel, and electronic health record documentation.

**Preferred Qualifications:**

- LPCC-S or LISW-S (NPI and Medicaid numbers, CAQH account)
- Previous experience working on and/or supervising an IHBT program.
