## **MINI-GRANTS: ANNOUNCEMENT OF FUNDING AVAILABILITY**

Mini-Grants have been established to provide a limited amount of, one time only, funds for small projects that provide creative and innovative opportunities for recreational and learning experiences that <u>improve and build upon positive mental health and/or</u> <u>provide alternatives to substance abuse</u>.

## **APPLICANTS:**

- 1. Applicants must be an organized group from Logan and/or Champaign Counties whose annual budget does not exceed \$250,000 and can give evidence of such; and who has the financial capability to account for the funds awarded.
- 2. Applicants may form around one event, and then disband.
- 3. Applicants may not have an annual budget of more than 50% State and/or Federal funds.
- 4. Funds may not be used to cover ongoing operating expenses.
- Potential Applicants: classrooms; church groups; small organizations serving children, youth and/or adults; probation departments; theaters; art groups; musical groups; PTAs, PTUs, PTOs; community/neighborhood groups; libraries; community service groups; small businessees; recreational groups; others.
- 6. Applicants may not have received a Mini-Grant for the same project from the MHDAS Board in previous years. The same program offered at a different site does not qualify. Any group that re-applies must specifically state how their program for the proposed project is different than the prior year.
- 7. Unless prior written arrangement had been made between the awardee and the MHDAS BOARD, Mini-Grant award activities or programs must occur and conclude between the award date and July 30, 2019.

#### **<u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:</u>** <u>ALL GRANT REPORTS DUE BY AUGUST 1, 2019</u>

- 1. Financial accounting requirements: After the expenses for the activities described in the mini-grant have been paid, a financial accounting shall be provided to the MHDAS Board showing the specific uses of the grant dollars using the budget submitted with the mini-grant.
- 2. Upon completion of efforts funded, the Mini-Grant recipients will provide a written report to the MHDAS Board on the success of the activity.
- 3. Applicants are encouraged to submit with their written report, supporting data, such as photos, testimonials, etc.
- 4. Grant recipients must identify MHDAS funding in program activities.

#### APPLICATION PROCESS:

1. INTERESTED PARTIES <u>MUST</u> REQUEST A RFP PACKET FROM THE MHDAS BOARD.

- A completed (typed or computer generated) Application using the MHDAS Board Guidelines & Mini-Grant Application Packet must be received or postmarked by <u>Friday November 9, 2018.</u>
- 3. Application must specifically state how the project will improve and/or build upon positive mental health and/or provide alternatives to substance abuse by addressing at least one asset category or one of the 40 Developmental Assets<sup>®</sup>.
- 4. Up to a total of \$18,000.00 will be awarded to the two counties (Logan/Champaign). It is expected several groups in each county will receive Grant funding. Partial awards may be made.
